
Every Student, Every Day, Find A Way ~ FAILURE Is Not An Option!

College/Career News — Last week we learned that A-G are a sequence of high school courses that students must complete to meet the College Entrance Requirement to be minimally eligible for admission to the University of California (UC) and California State University (CSU). These A-G subjects are the following: History (2 years), Science (2 years), English (4 years), Math (3-4 years recommended), Lab Science (2 years, UC recommends 3 years), Foreign Language (2 years, UC recommends 3), Visual/Performing Arts (1 year), and College Preparatory Elective (1 year). To be prepared to meet these requirements, it is therefore cruicial for us to acquire the skills and knowledge now to help us be successful in high school and college.
